Strategic Directions

- Continually improve program and service offerings based on participant feedback
- Identify, address and work to eliminate barriers to participation with underrepresented communities, particularly LGBTQ2SI+ communities, communities of colour and Indigenous communities
- Document and communicate program and service development, progress and impact
- Develop programs and services that encourage skill-building, and community capacity building
- Develop services and programs that are resourceful, cost-effective and creatively sustained

2. Continually deepen our internal capacity to foster, support and contribute to innovative solutions

- Embrace a workplace culture of learning, growth, risk-taking and collective skill building
- Recruit, hire and invest in the energy it takes to broaden diversity in our staff teams and partnerships
- Encourage a culture of listening and the valuing of ideas emerging from all levels of employment
- Diversify the sources of our resources, including financial resources, to maximize our flexibility, responsiveness and free agency

Programs & Services

Christie Ossington Neighbourhood Centre has established 4 key areas of focus in relation to our programs and services, which span four geographic sites and serve a range of target populations from children to youth to adults to seniors experiencing varying levels of housing and stability. 4 Key Areas of Focus:

Life Management

We envision a system of service coordination and community connections to empower and inspire essential stability, growth, autonomy, and joy in the lives of our participants. We will work to ensure access to social services and life skills for and with vulnerable community members.

We operate four shelters and twenty transitional housing units for homeless and underhoused people, as well as a drop-in program for adults and seniors living in, or at risk of falling into, poverty.

Health and Wellness

We envision a system of service coordination and community connections to encourage and support, both preventatively and responsively, mental and physical health and wellness for our participants and communities.

We operate programs for children (afterschool, literacy arts and recreation, camps, events and drop-in programs) and youth (drop-in programs, counselling, events and camps) We recognize that access to the arts and recreation are central to Health and wellness.

Income Security, Employment and Social Enterprise

We envision a community economy where all people are included and have access to skills-based capacity development and earned income opportunities. We create pathways to independence and prosperity.

We train, employ and support community members to pursue sustainable paid employment through LOFT Kitchen Café & Catering, as well as throughout our program and service areas.

Sustainable Housing

We envision a supportive eco-system combining both innovative programming and access to diverse housing options. We are dedicated to creating a community where all individuals have a space to call home.

We work with shelter and transitional housing residents, drop-in participants, and participants in all program areas to pursue safe and secure housing options.
